## ERRATA

Executive Summary, page ES-2:

It should read, “While there is no current shale gas development in the Northwest Territories and Nunavut, there are regulations in place that would cover such development.”

Page 31:

The first full paragraph, starting with the second sentence, reads, “In August 2010, construction of the TransCanada Groundbirch pipeline began. The pipeline will transport gas from northeast British Columbia to Kitimat, British Columbia, 645 km north of Vancouver for transport to Asia Pacific export markets. A Liquefied Natural Gas (LNG) facility is also being constructed on Bish Cove on First Nations land.”

It should read, “In August 2010, construction of the TransCanada Groundbirch pipeline began. The pipeline will transport gas from the Horn River Basin to the Alberta system. A planned Pacific Trail Pipeline will move gas from northeast British Columbia to Kitimat, British Columbia, 645 km north of Vancouver, for transport to Asia Pacific export markets. The Pacific Trail Pipeline would deliver gas to a Liquefied Natural Gas (LNG) facility that is being planned for Bish Cove on First Nations land.”
